Background:

Lees-McRae College hosts a student organization Open House at the end of Freshmen Orientation. What Makes This Unique:

Set up a table at a major school function. Print up flyers and pamphlets detailing the major points and goals of the Bonner Leader Program. Be very active in talking with those who ask for information.

Recommendations:

Be sure to have Bonners lined up well in advance to work the table. Make sure all information is printed up and accurate. Follow-up with an email or an invitation for interested students to attend a Bonner meet and greet.
