## Senior Capstone Presentation

**Date:** March 31, 2003

**Time:** 9:00 P.M.

**Time Limit:** 15 Minutes

### **Description:**

The senior capstone is an opportunity for graduating seniors to reflect with their fellow Bonner Scholars about the impact of the Bonner Scholars Program on their lives, their work's impact in the community, and their overall understanding of community service and social justice issues.

The senior capstone should represent the culmination of the Bonner Scholar's years in the program including lessons learned, connection of service with academics, understanding of world issues, and the spirit of the team.

### **Questions for reflection:**

1. How have you progressed in your understanding of issues in Knox County and Appalachia during your time in the program? United States (if not US citizen)?
2. How have your skills and subsequent responsibilities increased?
3. What has been the most valuable experience that you have had as a Bonner Scholar?
4. How did your summer service activities affect you?
5. How have your fellow Bonners affected you?
6. What have you learned as a Bonner that you might not have learned had you not been in the program?
7. Have you made a real change in the world through your service?

### **Suggestions for capstone projects:**

Senior capstone presentations may take any artistic and/or creative form that the Scholar wants. There is no set format for your presentation. You may:

1. Develop a series of photographs for display
2. Review your journals
3. Construct a Power Point presentation/slide show
4. Write a song
5. Write a poem
6. Write an essay
7. Give a speech
8. Paint a picture
9. Create a video

Etc., etc., etc.

This is a free expression presentation. Do what you want, but remember that your fellow Bonners will remember this as the representation of your learning and growth as a Bonner Scholar.

You may also invite anyone that you like to your presentation. Expect that advisory committee members, placement supervisors, and the President may also be present.
